NOTE FOR THE CABINET

Subject: Implementation issues on Predhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maan-dhan (PM-SYM) Pension Scheme for Unorganized Workers

1. Introduction:

297/2023/W.I-DGLW 562506/2021/O/o DGLW

Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Mann-dhan (PM-SYM), a pension scheme for Unorganized Workers is being implemented for an estimated 42 crores workers in the unorganized Sector constituting around 88% of the total Labour force of the country.PM-SYM has been made effective since 15th Feb, 2019 in all states. It is central sector scheme open to unorganised workers, whose monthly income is Rs 15000/- or below and who has an Aadhar number as well as savings bank account. The minimum age for joining the scheme is 18 years and the maximum is 40 years. It is a voluntary and contribution based scheme under which the subscriber would be paid an assured minimum monthly pension of Rs 3000/- from the age of 60 years enwards. Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) has been chosen as Pension Fund Manager and shall be responsible for pension pay-out. The contribution under the scheme is to the extent of 50 % by the subscriber and 60 % by the Government of India.

2. Background

In order to provide a comprehensive social security umbrella so as to improve life, dignity and working conditions of unorganised workers, Ministry of Labour and Employment enacted The Unorganized Workers' Social Security Act, 2008 (UWSS SECRET

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562506/2021/O/o DGLW

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Act) which aims to provide for social security and welfare of the unorganised workers. Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maari-dhan (PM-SYM) Yojana was introduced to provide Old Age Protection for the welfare of unorganised workers under section 3 (1) (e) of the UWSS Act, 2008. The scheme was approved by the Cabinet in its meeting held on 01.02.2019 and thereafter announced by Hon'ble FM in his budget speech. Further, a detailed scheme was notified vide No. SO, 764(E) dated 07.02.2019. The notification was vetted by Department of Legislative and was issued with the approval of Union Finance Minister and MoS (IC) L&E.

3. Proposal

This proposal seeks further approval of the Cabinet for

- (i) Inclusion of the Common Service Centres (CSC e-Governance Services India Ltd.) under Meity, Government of India as enrolment agency for the scheme at the rate of Rs. 30/- per enrolment.
- (ii) Providing provisions for allowing beneficiary's contribution to be paid, fully or partially, by other Ministries/Departments/Welfare Boards/ other agencies of Central & State Governments, to enhance the outreach of the Scheme.
- (iii) Providing flexibility under administrative expenses to be frontloaded in the initial years (col.5 of the Table at para 5) due to heavy expenses in IEC activities at the beginning of the scheme, however, keeping total administrative expenses in five years within the limit of 0.5%.
- (iv) The operational guidelines for the scheme including those relating to mode of payment, the tenure of deposit, auto-debit and other related matters for its smooth implementation will be issued with the approval of Union Minister of Labour & Employment.

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(v) To set up an Empowered Committee under the Chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary with Secretaries of Labour & Employment, Rural Development, Agriculture Housing & Urban Affairs, MSME, Melt Y. Textiles. Department of Expenditure, Department of Financial Services and any other concerned Secretary as members to review and monitor implementation of the scheme through appropriate implementation strategies.

4. Justification

- 4.1 The current proposal would enable the scheme to outleach the prospective subscribers though country-wide network of about 3.15 lakh active Common Service Centres. These centres are already carrying out various welfare schemes of the Central Government. The unorganized workers are mostly engaged as home based workers, street vendors, milday moal workers, head loaders, brick kiln, cobblers, rag pickers, domestic workers, washer men, Rickshaw Pullers, own account workers, leather workers, Audio- visual workers, etc. and these centres are located well within the reach of such unorganised workers.
- 4.2 The focussed and targeted IEC activities will help disseminating information of the scheme to the prospective beneficiaries. The administrative expenses @0.5% of the budget were approved by the cabinet. But it may not suffice as initial expenses for launch & IEC activities shall be much more than earlier envisaged. Therefore, the proposed expenditure under administrative expenses including IEC & IT (col.5) are to be front loaded towards the earlier years keeping the total administrative expenses for 5 years intaot as shown in the table at para 4.

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4.3 As LIC had expressed difficulties in the front end operations due to its limited number of outlets, therefore CSC with its pan- India presence and yast outreach was roped in. The enrollment charges of Rs 30/- per enrollment on a prorate basis, as in Ayushman Bharat Scheme shall be paid to CSC which have to be accounted for in addition to Administrative Expenses (0.5%)

5. Financial Implications

The targeted population of the unorganized workers under the age group 18-40 is about 25 crore people. The scheme has been envisaged for 10 crore beneficiaries over a period of 5 years. The financial implications are estimated as follows:
